DESCRIPTIONS

Although these plants are for conservation purposes only and shall not be used as ornamentals or for landscaping (SWCD Act), landowners living in urban areas are encouraged to plant these species as they can provide wildlife habitats, shade, windbreaks, or erosion control.

TREES & SHRUBS

American Redbud: Medium growing rounded deciduous broadleaf tree. Good fall colors, purplish pink flowers in early spring. H:15-25' W:10-20' Full sun to partial shade.

Crimson Sunset Maple: Medium growing upright/oval broadleaf tree. Great maroon foliage all summer. Cross between Crimson King and Red Sunset. H: 30-35' W: 20-25' Full sun.

Fall Fiesta Maple: Rapid growing rounded broadleaf tree. Turns orange, red and yellow in fall. Hardy and adaptable to most soils. H: 50-60' W: 30-40' Full sun.

Red Oak: Rapid growing spreading deciduous. Turns red-orange in fall. H: 75-90' W: 40-60' Full sun.

Bur Oak: Medium growing rounded deciduous. Turns golden yellow in fall, large stately landscape specimen. H:50-100' W: 34-45' Full sun.

Eastern White Pine: Grows in average, medium, well-drained soil in full sun. Prefers full sun, fertile soils and cool, humid climates. Rapid growing, long-lived, needled evergreen. H:50-80' W:20-40'

Colorado Blue Spruce: Grows in average, acidic, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates some light shade. Medium to large, narrow, pyramidal conifer. H:30-60' W:10-20'

Norway Spruce: Large, evergreen coniferous tree. Prized for blue-green needles color and excellent landscape form. H:50-125' W:20-45'

Bailey's Red Osier Dogwood: Prefers organically rich, medium to wet soils. Leaves change from green to red/orange and eventually purple in autumn. Stems turn bright red in winter. Tiny, fragrant, white flowers in late spring. Fruit ripens in summer and is attractive to birds. H: 5-6' W: 5-6' Full sun to partial shade.

Lilac- Common Purple: Medium growing vase-like deciduous broadleaf shrub. Fragrant lilac flowers in late spring. H: 6-12' W: 6-12' Full sun.

American Hazelnut: Slow growing rounded deciduous broadleaf shrub. Fragrant white flowers in spring, brown nut in fall. H: 6-8' W: 6-8'

Russian Sage: Short habit, long blooming fragrant flowers. Attracts hummingbirds.

Black Walnut: Medium growing deciduous tree. Excellent lumber quality, produces nuts utilized by wildlife. H:50-75' W: 50-75'

Hosta: Shade plant with white and green leaves. H: 18-24"
