PURPOSE:

The Jim Rutherford Scholarship has been established by the McLean County Soil and Water Conservation District Foundation to assist outstanding agricultural students at any Illinois College. The student awarded the scholarship should demonstrate superior agricultural academic achievement, commitment to soil and water conservation and potential for innovation and/or leadership ability. The Jim Rutherford Scholarship is awarded in the fall semester of the academic year. The fall 2025 scholarship award will be \$1,000.

HISTORY:

The McLean County Soil & Water Conservation District was organized in March 1942. On May 8, 1942, an election for five directors was held. Frank Hubert of Saybrook was elected chairman; Charles Richardson of Ellsworth, vice-chairman; Byron Kline of LeRoy, secretary; E.D. Hess of Arrowsmith and Harry Miller of Saybrook, directors.

Currently, the District's governing body consists of five directors, who must be owners or occupiers of land within the district boundaries. Each director is elected for a two-year term at the district's annual meeting, which is held in January or February.

Any student who is currently a high school senior and will be enrolled in an Agricultural program for the 2025-2026 academic year at any college (junior college or four year university) in Illinois is eligible.

1. Demonstrates academic ability and achievement
2. Commitment to soil and water conservation
3. Potential for innovation and leadership ability
4. McLean County Resident

SELECTION PROCESS:

Please submit applications to McLean County Soil & Water Conservation District Foundation 402 N. Kays Drive Normal, IL 61761. Applications will be accepted from students until **March 14, 2025**. Applications must be complete and accompanied by the Application Form, Transcript, and Letters of Recommendation. The McLean County Soil & Water Conservation Foundation Board shall review all applications and select the student to be awarded the Jim Rutherford Scholarship. Winner will be notified early May.

Any student who is currently a high school senior and will be enrolled in an Agricultural program for the 2025-2026 academic year at any college (junior college or four year university) in Illinois is eligible. To be eligible a student must:

1. Be a high school senior soon to be enrolled at any Illinois College in agriculture.
2. Be a resident of McLean County.
3. Have a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale OR a 4.0 on a 5.0 scale.
4. Submit a copy of their latest transcript.
