### DESCRIPTIONS

Although these plants are for conservation purposes only and shall not be used as ornamentals or for landscaping (SWCD Act), landowners living in urban areas are encouraged to plant these species as they can provide wildlife habitat, shade, windbreaks, or erosion control.

#### **TREES & SHRUBS**

**Weeping Willow:** Rapid growing rounded deciduous broadleaf tree. Very colorful and hardy. Prefers wetter soil. H:50-80' W:50-80' Full sun

**Red Pointe Maple:** Medium growing broadly pyramidal deciduous broadleaf tree. Dark green leaves turn brilliant red in fall. H: 40-45' W: 25-30' Full sun.

**Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple:** Medium growing rounded deciduous broadleaf tree. Orange, red, and yellow in the fall. H: 50'- 75' W: 50' Full sun.

**Bur Oak:** Medium growing rounded deciduous tree. Large stately landscape specimen. Turns Golden yellow in fall. H: 50-100' W: 35-45' Full sun.

**Swamp White Oak:** Medium growing rounded deciduous tree. Turns golden yellow in fall. Tolerates wet soils. H:40-50' W: 30-40' Full sun.

**Eastern White Pine:** Grows in average, medium, well-drained soil. Prefers full sun, fertile soils and cool, humid climates. Rapid growing, long-lived, needled evergreen. H:50-80' W:20-40'

**Colorado Blue Spruce:** Grows in average, acidic, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates some light shade. Medium to large, narrow, pyramidal conifer. H:30-60' W:10-20'

**Norway Spruce:** Large, evergreen coniferous tree. Prized for blue-green needles color and excellent landscape form. H:50-125' W:20-45'

**Black Hills Spruce:** Slow growing pyramidal coniferous evergreen tree. Dark green color. Stays tight and neat. H: 15-20' W: 8-15'

White Fir: Medium growing pyramidal coniferous evergreen tree. Likes acidic soil. Stately landscape specimen. H: 90-120' W: 30-50'

**Black Chokeberry:** Slow growing spreading deciduous broadleaf shrub. Dark red fall colors, black berries in fall. H: 6-8' W: 4-6'

**Gray Dogwood:** Medium growing upright deciduous broadleaf shrub. White flowers bloom in late spring. Red fruit attracts wildlife in late summer. H: 6-10' W: 6-10'

**American Hazelnut**: medium growing rounded deciduous broadleaf shrub. Heart shaped leaves turn yellow to orange in fall. Produces edible nuts in late summer to early fall. H: 8-12' W: 8-12'.

**Tree Protector:** This is a 2 or 4 foot vinyl sheet tree protector that wraps around the base of the tree with included zip ties and included wooden stake.
