Putting plants under stress (i.e. lack of water, planting too deep or too shallow, or a delay in planting) will weaken the plants and lessen survival rates. Do not plant larger trees too close to buildings, sidewalks, driveways or utilities. It is your responsibility to learn proper planting techniques and to select appropriate planting sites. The District cannot be responsible for replacing stock that do not survive.

DESCRIPTIONS

Although these plants are for conservation purposes only and shall not be used as ornamentals or for landscaping (SWCD Act), landowners living in urban areas are encouraged to plant these species as they can provide wildlife habitat, shade, windbreaks, or erosion control.

TREES & SHRUBS

Sugar Maple: Tall deciduous broadleaf tree. Good fall colors, sweet sap for maple syrup. H:60-100' W:40-60'. Full sun.

Fall Red Maple: Rapid growing pyramidal deciduous broadleaf tree. Dazzling red fall color. H: 50-60' W: 30-40'. Full sun.

Bur Oak: Rapid growing hardy deciduous tree. Turns burgundy red with tinges of burnt orange in the fall. Very hardy and adaptable to most soils. H: 50' to 80'; W: 30' to 60'. Full sun.

Swamp White Oak: Medium growing rounded deciduous tree. Good golden fall color. H:40-50' W: 30 -40' Full sun.

American Hornbeam: Slow growing rounded deciduous broadleaf tree. Fluted gray bark, good yellow -orange fall color. H: 20-35' W: 15-30' Full sun to shade.

Eastern White Pine: Grows in average, medium, well-drained soil. Prefers full sun, fertile soils and cool, humid climates. Rapid growing, long-lived, needled evergreen. H:50-80' W:20-40'

Colorado Blue Spruce: Grows in average, acidic, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates some light shade. Medium to large, narrow, pyramidal conifer. H:30-60' W:10-20'

Norway Spruce: Large, evergreen coniferous tree. Prized for blue-green needles color and excellent landscape form. H:50-125' W:20-45'

Black Hills Spruce: Slow growing pyramidal coniferous evergreen tree. Dark green color. Stays tight and neat. H: 15-20' W: 8-15'

White Fir: Slow growing pyramidal evergreen conifer. Attractive silver-blue to blue-green needles. Excellent form. H: 40-70' w: 15-30' Full sun to partial shade.

Coreopsis: Perennial wildflower with daisy like flowers. Long bloom time, attracts pollinators. Full sun.

Purple Coneflower: Perennial wildflower with purple petals around orange-brown cone centers. Attracts pollinators and birds. Full sun.

Black-eyed Susan: Perennial wildflower with bright yellow petals around dark black cone centers. Attracts pollinators. Full sun.

Northwind Switch Grass: Upright clumping warm-season perennial grass. Steel blue to olive-green foliage turns golden yellow in fall. Full sun.

Prairie Dropseed Grass: Fine textured warm-season perennial grass with arching emerald-green leaves. Fragrant pinkish-brown panicles in late summer. Golden fall color. Full sun.

Red Osier Dogwood: Medium growing upright deciduous broadleaf shrub. White to bluish berries in late summer, brilliant red twigs glow in winter. H: 5-6' W: 5-6' Full to partial shade.

Purple Lilac: Medium growing rounded deciduous broadleaf shrub. Fragrant purple flowers in spring and summer. H: 4-6' W: 4-6'. Full sun.

Black Chokeberry: Multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with white pink spring flowers, glossy black berries, and brilliant red fall color. Attracts wildlife. Full sun to partial shade.

Tree Protector: This is a 2 foot vinyl sheet tree protector that wraps around the base of the tree with included zip ties and included wooden stake.
